Subject: Notification of the C-51 South Side Slope Tree Removal Project from Big Blue Trace east to Forest Hill Blvd.

Dear Resident:

The South Florida Water Management District (District) is a regional governmental agency that oversees the water resources in the southern half of the state. Our mission is to protect South Florida's water resources by balancing and improving flood control, water supply, water quality, and natural systems.

The District conducts regular inspections of the regional water management system — which includes more than 2,100 miles of canals — to prioritize projects necessary for the system's continued operation and flood protection for South Florida's 8.1 million residents. Through the inspection program, the District has identified the need to remove vegetation hanging into or over the C-51 Canal's south side slope of the District's right-of-way between Big Blue Trace and Forest Hill Boulevard. The District's south right-of-way is separated from your property by the Acme Improvement District's right-of-way. (Please see the attached map.) The District will not be removing vegetation in the Acme Improvement District's right-of-way.

The contractor is expected to start removing vegetation off the District's south side slope right-of-way on March 27, 2017. This effort should last no more than 30 days.
